- 2. Why would it be damaging to you or others to use your freedom to satisfy your flesh/sinful nature?
- 3. How would it benefit you or others to use your freedom to serve one another in love?

Read 2 Corinthians 4:10-18.

- 4. Which verse is most significant to you? Why?
- 5. While you serve, how might your suffering reveal the life of Jesus?
- 6. What would cause you to give thanks to God in the midst of suffering?
- 7. What serving opportunities would you like to explore?

- 8. What's one way you'd like to serve someone this week?
- 9. What causes you to feel like giving up?
- 10. What can help you persevere according to verses 16-18?
