Conversation Starter

Is there a scene or two from a movie or great story that captures what you want for your marriage? What is it? What about the scene grabs you?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Romans 6:19-22.

- 1. What difference should your *freedom in Christ* have in your marriage or close relationships?
- 2. What does it mean to become holy?
- 3. What does your spouse or close friend do that drives you crazy? What does that reveal about you?
- 4. What are some things you're learning about God as a result of difficulties in marriage or close relationships?

Read Ephesians 5:25-26.

- 5. In your own words, describe how *Christ loved the church*.
- 6. What does it look like for a husband to love his wife in this way?
- 7. How do these principles apply to all our relationships?

Read <u>2 Timothy 2:23-25</u>; <u>Hebrews 12:14</u>.

- 8. How do you usually respond when things get difficult in your marriage?
- 9. What practical steps can you take to promote peace with your spouse?

Read Romans 1:12; Ephesians 4:15.

- 10. How does your personal relationship with Christ affect the spiritual growth of your marriage?
- 11. How can you encourage spiritual growth in your spouse or friend without being judgmental or condescending?
- 12. If God uses conflict as a way to help us give and receive love, how does that impact the way you look at your marriage? How does that help reframe your most difficult relationships?

Summarize

Based on the message, materials and conversations this week, what would you say is *God's purpose for marriage*? How does that relate to God's purpose for relationships in general?

Soul Training

Identify areas in your marriage or close friendships that you find challenging. Ask God what He might be trying to reveal or teach you about yourself.
